

# Treasurer's Report



The 2020 Actual Results and 2021 Budget were presented and approved at the Spring Meeting. The budget details can be found in the Spring Meeting Presentation Deck on our website.

#### 2021 REVENUE

Did you know that the KLCOA owns and protects land on the Kennisis<sub>Annual General Meeting</sub> Lakes for our community?


Fall 2021

The KLCOA owns several land parcels on our lakes including:

- The Blueberry Islands
- Bullfrog Bay Lands
- Two Loon Island (Island C)
   Haliburton Highlands Land Trust (HHLT) owns
   Norah's Island and the KLCOA supports the management and protection of the island through the Norah's Island Management Committee (NIMC).

#### **NEW! - Soap Pond Lands**

Soap Pond (or Lipsey Bay) is in the SW corner of Kennisis Lake. Dysart et al has agreed to transfer ownership to the KLCOA, to be protected in its natural state. The legal land transfer activities are now underway.

#### Hazard and Navigation Markers

• The KLCOA Hazard and Navigation Marker Program continued in 2021. - Pat O'Keefe (Co-Ordinator)

#### <u> 2021 – No Wake Marker Buoys</u>

 The KLCOA will deployed "NO WAKE" markers in several channels to remind boaters to limit speed and reduce wake in these areas that are popular swimming and recreation locations. These were reported to be successful in keeping boat traffic to lower speeds during the 2021 deployment.

Markers are removed in the fall and redeployed in the spring of the following year.

#### **Background**

The County of Haliburton has many lakes that serve important environmental, economic and social roles. The health of our lakes is important for residents and husinesses.

#### **Purpose**

As part of the public consultation process, the Consultants (HESL and JLR) are hosting a Virtual Open House to seek feedback on scientific literature review and options for the shoreline preservation by-law.

#### **Red Pine Lake Dam Replacement**



#### Commenced: August 2021

#### Scope:

- full replacement of the dam with a concrete two sluice dam
- dredging of the river and portion of the lake to allow for barges to move construction material and equipment to and from the site
- · refurbishment of mechanical equipment
- public safety improvements

#### Status:

- Contractor is assembling the barge that will be used to support dredging work.
- Very little winter work due to limited access means this project is expected to span three years.

# A long-overdue conversation

The 2021 **KENNISIS ALL OF US** initiative was our first comprehensive community-wide survey since 2005

#### It was designed to:

- 1. Give everyone in our community a voice and genuine opportunity to be heard
- 2. Help give all of us a better understanding of what we are loving and what we're not so keen on
- Ensure the KLCOA is accurately representing and investing in our community's issues, interests and values





# A long-overdue conversation

- Our survey was open from May 26<sup>th</sup> to July 31<sup>st</sup>
- Everyone was invited: Members, Member's families, non-Members, full-time and seasonal residents
  - Eblasts sent to 1200 people
  - 200 Survey notices hand-delivered to non-Member properties
  - 8 full surveys were hand delivered to those without internet access





### Then and now

334 surveys completed

One survey per cottage membership

**Not Anonymous** 



791 surveys completed

718 Members73 Non-members








#### Our thirst for knowledge





## ...and each other!

The KLCOA received over 150 comments from our Community about how some behaviors on our lakes directly impact everyone's enjoyment.

By far the most consistent themes were concerns about boat wakes, boating etiquette, the impact of short-term rentals and potential overdevelopment.








#### We asked Members about the KLCOA's level of support or advocacy for various areas:

#### Overall, a high level of positive feedback

In 16 out of 17 areas, more than 81% of you think that we should be doing at least the same as we are currently doing with many saying we should be doing more.

('Same as we are currently doing' and 'More than we are currently doing' combined)

In the open-ended feedback, we heard from a number of you about how the KLCOA may or may not represent you. We need to find a better way of collecting and representing the views of our majority membership while better reflecting the opinions of other groups in our community.

We definitely need to survey our Community more regularly and offer more chances for ongoing dialogue.




## The KLCOA Report Card

We asked you how you feel the KLCOA is performing overall.

639 people took the time to tell us. 594 seem to think we are doing at least a good job overall.

93% thought we were doing excellent or good with some room for improvement. 4% thought we weren't doing so well.

## Non-Members: preliminary results

#### We had 73 non-Members respond

44 of them used to be Members at one time.

The 2 top reasons for lapsed membership were being 'too busy to get involved' and a sense that the KLCOA 'did not really represent me'

For respondents who've never joined, they were also too busy (19%) or just didn't know what the KLCOA offered (22%)...duly noted!





## Non-Members...preliminary results

We asked non-members if they would enjoy participating in a number of different activities.

More than 80% of non-Members said the fireworks

#### and more than 60% indicated Art on the Dock

- Over 87% cited maintaining natural shorelines as key to their future enjoyment of the lake
- 90% are keen to protect the traditional rights of way
- 80% stress the importance of tranquility

#### Their greatest concern?

85% are concerned / very concerned about

## Learning and changing priorities

 Based on these results, the KLCOA agrees to share clear priorities for the next two years

Decide what to start, stop and keep doing

- Be clear about Member benefits to non-Members, new cottagers and younger members of our community
- Facilitate new and existing programs and activities for all age groups
- Determine how to engage more volunteers
- Agree on our levels of advocacy, clarify our mandate and ensure everyone's voices are acknowledged
- Open more regular channels of communication


